In a nutshell...



"Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is a set of principles and guidelines that aim to develop expert learners by using a variety of teaching methods to lower barriers to learning and give all learners equal opportunities to succeed" Guidance, p.11

The Principles: UDL is about building more flexibility, accessibility, learner voice and choice into the design of FET programmes to reduce barriers to learning by:

Providing engagement that "clicks" with learners helping to answer the "why" question about learning.



Representing content in different ways so every learner can understand and internalise the 'what' of learning.



Giving learners options and strategies for 'how' they express themselves so all learners have equal opportunities to act on what they've learned.



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The Benefits of adopting a UDL approach in FET include:

Lower perceived and actual barriers for a wide range of FET learners

Enhanced learner motivation and engagement Addressing more learner needs through learning design and focussing on learner strengths

More flexibility in FET provision and a reduction in the need for individual accommodations








The UDL for FET Guidance Aims to:
