Dublin accounts for 30.2% of employment in Ireland (692,100 persons)

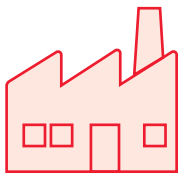

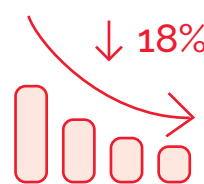
The number of females in employment fell by 20,200 persons (6.3%); the fall in employment for males was smaller at 5,700 (or 1.5%)

Work Force



65.1%
The labour force participation rate decreased from 65.7% in Q1 to **65.1% in Q3**, remaining the highest rate across all regions

Professional , scientific and technical activities



The professional, scientific & technical activities sector saw the largest absolute decline in employment (12,100 persons or an **18% decrease**), with the wholesale & retail sector recording the largest increase (11,100 persons)

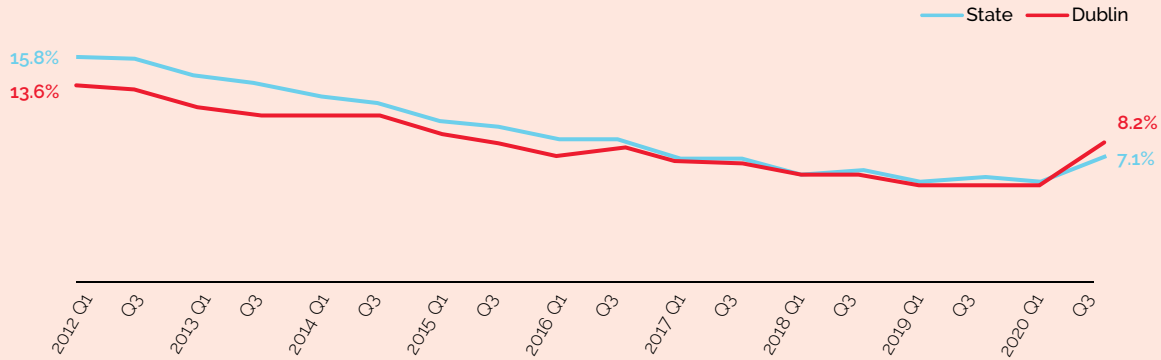

Region rates – Overall comments



Dublin had the **highest unemployment rate** in Q3 2020 across all regions

Dublin's UE rate was **consistently lower** than that of the State (since q1 2012) until Q2 2020 when it surpassed the State and remained higher again in Q3 2020

Pandemic Unemployment Payments - Week 44

Persons receiving Pandemic Unemployment Payment in the **Dublin** region:

- **108,300 persons**, compared to 175,500 in May 2020 (Week 18)
- Accounting for **15.6% of the labour force*** in the region (14.4% overall in the State) (the highest share across all regions)
- 22.6% (or 24,400 persons) **aged under 25 years** (25.3% for the State) (the lowest share across all regions)
- **46.0% female** (50.4% for the State) (the only region where males accounted for a higher share)
