Employment in the South West region increased by **37,100 persons (or 11%)**.

Participation rate

At 63.7%, in Q3 2022, the participation rate in the South West region was just below the overall participation rate for the State (64.8%), despite an increase of 2.4 percentage points between Q3 2019 and Q3 2022.

Employment increased for males and females, with the increase higher for females (15% or 22,700 persons) than for males (8% or 14,400 persons).

Occupation



More than two thirds of the total increase in employment in the South West region was for professional occupations (+25,100 persons). The largest decline was for elementary occupations, where employment fell by 8,900 persons (-23%).

- Industry employed the highest number of persons in the South West region (60,600 persons).
- Between Q3 2019 and Q3 2022, health & social work had the largest absolute increase in persons employed (11,700 more persons, or a 29% increase), while the highest % increase was for finance etc (+53%, or 3,700 persons).
- Administrative & support service activities had the largest absolute and % decrease in persons employed (4,000 fewer persons, or a 25% fall).



South West State

Overall comments

- Between Q3 2019 and Q3 2022, the South West region added the second largest number of persons to the workforce (after Dublin), with 37,100 extra workers. Over half of these additional workers were in the health/social welfare or wholesale/retail sectors.
- The ICT sector also grew strongly (second highest relative growth rate in the region, at 36%) and while several ICT companies nationally have announced job losses, numerous companies in the South West made job creation announcements for this sector throughout 2022 (e.g. NetApp, valid8Me).
- The South West region had the largest fall (in both absolute and relative terms) in the number of elementary workers; indeed, this region accounted for 62% of the total national decline in the number of persons employed in elementary occupations in Ireland.
- In Q3 2022, at 3.6%, the unemployment rate in the South West was below the national average (4.5%) and the lowest compared to all other regions, while its participation rate (at 63.7%) was below the national average (64.8%).
- The South West region had the second highest share of third level graduates in its adult population (after Dublin).
